



Residents Free Parking Permits

Conditions for the Issue and Use of Permits

1. Permits can only be issued to persons currently residing within the boundaries of the City of Fremantle. Permits are not available for commercial properties or ratepayers who are not residents.
2. This permit exempts the holder from the payment of parking fees during the following times ONLY (including public holidays):

Monday - Friday:

- Valid between the hours of 9am - 11am and then again between 3pm – 5pm. The permit is valid only for on-street parking (not car parks). Permit holders must at all times abide by the posted time limits (ie. 15 minute, 30 minute, 1 hour, etc), also
- Valid between the hours of 5pm – 1am for on-street parking (not car parks). Permit holders are exempt from the 3 hours time limit during this period.

Saturday - Sunday:

- Valid between the hours of 8am – 7.30pm in car park 6 only (the multi-level car park located in Point Street), also
- Valid between the hours of 5pm – 1am for on-street parking (not car parks). Permit holders are exempt from the 3 hours time limit during this period.

3. The permit does not authorize parking in these areas: ACROD bays, No Parking areas, No Standing zones, Loading Zones, No Stopping Areas, Taxi Zones, Bus Zones, Tour Coach Zones, Authorised Parking Only areas, Permit Zones and Private Property Parking areas.
4. Unless otherwise notified, permits will remain valid for 12 months from the date of issue. **It is the applicants responsibility to renew their permit upon expiry as reminder notices are not issued.**
5. A maximum of two permits will be issued per property.
6. The applicant is required to provide the City with proof of residential status. A ratepayer who resides in the City of Fremantle can provide the rates assessment number. Residents only can provide a copy of a current tenancy agreement or a copy of a current drivers license showing your residential address.
7. The applicant is required to provide the City with proof of vehicle ownership.
8. In the case of an employer provided vehicle, a letter must be provided from the employer stating that the applicant has permission to use the vehicle for private use within Fremantle.
9. Making a false or misleading entry on the application form or applying for a permit without a legitimate entitlement will result in any permits previously issued being withdrawn and the offending person being permanently prohibited from being issued any further permits.
10. Holders of valid Residential Parking Permits are entitled to the same parking concessions and do not need to apply for an additional permit. Visitor's Parking Permits are not eligible for this concession.

11. Permits will also be issued to the carers of non-car owning City of Fremantle residents and ratepayers who are (a) aged pensioners or (b) persons with disabilities. In such circumstances, the following is required:
 - (a) proof of residence for the aged pensioner or person with disabilities;
 - (b) proof of vehicle ownership for the carer's vehicle;
 - (c) a statutory declaration signed by the carer, stating that the permit is to be used for the purpose assisting the aged pensioner or person with the disabilities with their transport needs in Fremantle.
12. Permits are not transferable to another person.
13. A permit can be transferred to another vehicle on application to the City of Fremantle.
14. The permit must be attached to the vehicle's windscreen, passenger side bottom left hand corner.
15. "Vehicle" is defined as a motor car capable of carrying up to nine persons, utility with a carrying capacity of 1000kg or less, a van with a carrying capacity of 1000kg or less, a motorcycle, a motorcycle with a sidecar, or tricycle motorcycle.
16. There are no fees for Residents & Ratepayers Free Parking Permits.
17. Please ensure that if you sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle you remove the sticker and bring it in to the Service & Information Centre for a replacement for your new vehicle (the entitlement for the permit does not transfer to the new owner with the vehicle). A statutory declaration is required should you not be able to present the sticker.
