Foxes have played a major role in the decline of a number of native species. Foxes are mainly carnivorous and will target all kinds of prey including small to medium mammals, birds, reptiles, carrion and fruit. In urban areas, they will also raid rubbish bins and pet food. Their numbers are increasing in most parts of Australia, including urban areas.

The City of Fremantle is committed to protecting our environment and we are implementing a project to help reduce the impact that foxes have on our native animals. You can help us by letting us know about any foxes you have seen recently in the Melville or Fremantle areas.

**Direction of travel:** it was going in a south-westerly direction

**Sighting:** Please provide any relevant details

eg, an adult fox was running along the western walking trail about 300m along from the Kent St entry. The animal appeared to be in good condition and looked like it had a bird in its mouth.
